Principal's Report

1964-65

When, over 20 years ago, the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate decided to start an institution of higher learning in Thevara, they had placed before them the noble ideal that the young men committed to their charge should be shaped and moulded into fine gentlemen, intellectually competent, morally correct, emotionally mature and physically robust. In other words, they contemplated an all round education for our youths. We have always kept this noble aim in our view, and we have endeavoured in our humble way, to achieve this goal. One instance, we may point out in pursuance of the above object, is the introduction, this year, of regular weekly classes in Moral Science for all the students of the College.

Course of study

During the current year, the University decided to drop the Pre-University course and start in its place the two-year Pre-Degree course, and the first batch of students for this course has been admitted this year. At the time when the Pre-University course was started a few years ago, it was expected that it was a great reform, and that it would stay as such. Unfortunately the scheme could not work successfully, and the University has now introduced the two-year Pre-Degree course. To speak out of one year's experience, this change is certainly to be welcomed, and it promises a greater chance of improvement in standards.

We have also, during the current year, introduced the Post-Graduate course in

English Language and Literature, and the B. A. Degree course in Sociology. This brings up the number of the various Graduate Degree courses offered in this College to nine, and of the Post-Graduate Degree courses to six, in addition to the Post-Graduate Diploma course in Social Service.

The College has been, in recent years, considerably growing in the numerical strength of students. From about a thousand, five years ago, the strength in the current year has reached the peak figure of one thousand, six hundred and twelve. I am not sure whether this great increase in number is a matter on which we should think of congratulating ourselves. Larger numbers call for larger provisions of accommodation and equipment, not to speak of the problems they create, of management and discipline.

Accommodation and Equipments

To meet the requirements of the increased strength of students, the Management has added certain extensions to the buildings during the current year. The expansion of the Zoology Department has been completed. The extension to the Sociology block is partly completed. A new block of rooms near the water tank, intended for the Post-Graduate class in English is being completed and will be occupied soon.

A Rifle Range for the fast expanding N. C. C. units of the College, has been completed in the Lake-view play ground, and inaugurated a few days ago.

Our Library is becoming one of the finest in Kerala, and considerable additions to the stock of books have been made during the current year. Facilities for study and consultation within the Library, have been improved in general, and we are following the open access system for the Post-Graduate students. I must say, however, that not all students take advantage of the excellent library facilities that have been provided for them. One might take consolation in the old saying that one can only take the horse to the water, but cannot make it drink.

A Hobby Workshop has been added in the current year, to provide for the opportunities of our students to develop their manual and mechanical skills.

This year we have started a Text Book Library in aid of those students of our College, who are financially not in a position to provide themselves with text books of their own.

In all these development schemes we are deeply indebted, on the one hand, to the University Grants Commission, Government of India, for its very generous financial help, and, on the other hand, to Very Reverend Father Melesius, C.M.I., Prior of the Monastery and the President of the Managing Board of the College, who takes an abiding and personal interest in the progress and welfare of the College.

Staff

There have been considerable changes in the personnel of the Staff, mostly in terms of additions, as a result of the increased admissions to various classes, and the introduction of new courses of studies.

At the administrative level, Rev. Dr. James Aggaeus, C.M.I., was appointed Principal in the place of Rev. Dr. Theobald, C.M.I., who is at present the Principal of Newman College, Thodupuzha.

This is not the place to make an encomium of Dr. Theobald, who continues to be in the Staff, as Professor and Head of the Department of Zoology. Only his services are lent for the time being, in favour of the newly started College at Thodupuzha. It is a pleasure to say that during his eight years' tenure of the Principalship of this College, from 1953 to '56, and from 1959 to '64, Dr. Theobald has written himself indelibly into the growth and development of this Institution. We wish him success in his new job, and speedy return to our midst.

The starting of the Post-Graduate Eng. lish called for certain changes and additions in the Department of English. Sri T. C. Balakrishna Menon, Retired Professor of English, Maharaja's College, Ernakulam, was appointed the Associate Professor of English. Sri C. R. Sankara Menon, M.A., and Sri P.V. Krishnan Nair, M.A., B.T., were appointed lecturers and Sri K.K. Abraham, M.A., Sri A.R. Joseph, B.A., L.C.P. (London), Sri T.K. Sureshkumar, M.A., and Sri A.S. Narayanan Nambisan, B.Sc., B.T., were appointed Junior Lecturers in the place of Sri C.P. Sivadas, M.A., Sri Sunny Thomas, M.A., and Sri K.P. Balakrishnan, M.A. ido szods

In the Malayalam Department, Sri C.C. Chacko, Professor, retired from service during the current year, and Sri T.M. Paul, M.A., was promoted as Lecturer. The Lecturer in Hindi, Sri P.K. Narayanan Nair, also retired during this year and Sri P.J. Chacko, M.A., B.Ed., was appointed in his place.

Rev. Fr. Jos Festus, C.M.I., works as lecturer in Syriac, in the place of Rev. Fr. Gabinus, C.M.1., who is away in Canada, doing his higher studies at the University of Laval. Sri C. P. Chandrasekharan, B. Sc., was appointed Junior Lecturer in Physics. In the Chemistry Department, M/s.R.Sitarama Iyer, M.Sc., and K.T. Kerala Varma, M.Sc., were appointed lecturers. Sri A.J. Anto, M.Sc., was appointed in the Zoology Department, and Sri Jose Thomas, M.A., in the Economics Department. In the Sociolo-

Department Rev. Fr. J. Liguori, C.M.I., who recently returned after his higher studies in the U.S.A., was appointed Head of the Department. Sri P. J. Thomas, M.A., was appointed Junior Lecturer in the Mathematics Department.

I take this opportunity to place on record our heart-felt appreciation of the valuable services rendered to this Institution by Prof. C.C.Chacko and Sri P.K. Narayanan Nair, who have retired from service during the current academic year. Both of them have to their credit, a life time of devoted service to the cause of higher education in Kerala.

Results of the University Examinations held in March-April 1964

It is customary to judge the achievements of a College from the results obtained by it at the University Examinations. From this point as well, we have every reason to feel proud of ourselves. The results were excellent, far above average, and could compare favourably with those of any other College in Kerala.

Extra-curricular activities:

(a) Physical Education

The Department was very active during the current year, and as usual, we conducted the Fr. Bartholomew Memorial' Tournament in Basketball and Volleyball. We participated in the District Knock-out Tournaments in all games and won the trophy in Cricket and Basketball. In addition, our Basketball team won the Championship of the University of Kerala. Messrs Oommen Mathew,

III B.Com., and John Xavier, I B.Sc., of this College have been selected for the State Team and M/s. A.T. Joseph, III B.A., and Sebastian Mathew, III B.Com., have been selected for the University Team.

(b) N.C.C.

During the current year, facilities have been provided for 5 Companies in the Army Wing and one Platoon in the Naval Wing of the N.C.C. We have a Cadet strength of 1,070 and an Officer strength of 6. An important feature of the current year is the construction of the Rifle Range in the College ground with the assistance of a grant from the U.G.C.

(c) Social Service League

The Social Service League did very good work during this year. The Housing Group assisted in the thatching of 98 huts in the neighbourhood of the College. The Labour Corps did a lot of work cleaning the drains and foot-paths of the public roads round about the College. The Medical Aid Group supplied medicine and food to the sick and the needy in a generous measure, particularly during the period of food crisis. A good part of the funds of the League was raised by staging a benefit performance in the College Auditorium.

General Inspection Commission

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Samuel Mathai, along with other members of the General Inspection Commission, visited the College on 12-2-1965, and inspected the College. I may be permitted to state that they left the College with a very good impression of our work and achievements.

Endowment

We are happy to mention that His Grace Dr. Joseph Parecattil, Archbishop of Ernakulam, has graciously made an endowment of Rs. 1,000/- towards the award of a Gold Medal to the best student who comes out with a First or Second Class in English for the B.A.Degree Examination. This endowment is in commemoration of the Sacerdotal Silver Jubilee of His Grace, the Archbishop. The Medal will be called "Archbishop Parecattil Jubilee Memorial Gold Medal."

While expressing our gratitude to Hill Grace, it is our proud previlege to recall that His Grace is an Alumnus of this College (B.A., 1947), and was himself the Winner of "Karikuzhi Mathulla Memorial Gold Medal," for having passed with a First Class in Econo. mics for the B.A.Degree Examination in 1947.




Football Team, 1964-'65
