#### **GROUP B**

- 20. Attempt a comparative analysis of the women characters in the plays prescribed for your study.
- 21. "The humanist programme was also appropriated and deployed to produce great literary works - humanist-inspired works of literature even allowed for scepticism about the principles underlying the primary realm of power - the economy, politics, institutional religion - as well as criticism of the aims of humanism itself, " says Clare Carroll. Examine how Doctor Faustus reflects this clash between the values of the medieval world and the world of the emerging Renaissance.
