Wayanad, Flood Affected Areas, Heavy Rainfall



he younger generation of Panamaram, a village in Wayanad, cannot remember the last time it rained so heavily. Some have a faint memory about the monsoon of 2005. Still, according to tem, it wasn't heavy as this. Water well rose and a few were shifed to the slief camps. That's all. But this time, rain has been furious, eavy rains lashing the district over ie past few days have inundated the w-lying areas in the district, espeally in Panamaram and Mananawady. Thousands of people in these was have been shifted to relief camps. fater bodies are overflowing, roads re inundated and houses have colpsed. There is a huge loss in the agriliture sector. Above all, transportaon has been affected in many parts of e district. Buses have stopped serces in certain areas - such as Koyari, Valliyoorkkavu and Valad-where er roads are under water. The scenes at various relief camps it district are distressing. Thounds of people are living in a school ampound along with their families, hey had all run out of their houses hen water started rushing in, None them had anything in their hands (see the had anything in their hands scept what they were wearing. Nor et hey sure if anything will be left in e houses when they return. It was just two months back that seni had given birth. Now, along with r husband Sankaran, she is in a refer camp. Residents of Parakkuni, ey have no other place togo. They are irrently staying in a classor month to reflef camp on Wednesday night.

Leeni and Sankaran were brought to e relief camp on Wednesday night.

"The Thamarassery Ghat road caved in twice. Movement of vehicles on the ghat road has been restricted. This has affected the movement of goods to and from the district, leading to a shortage of necessary goods too. Prices are also going up," he said. Dileep said all arrangements have been made to supply food for people in relief camps. "Panamaram is one of the lowlying areas in Wayanad. Many of the places in the block panchayat are inundated. Houses have been destroyed. We had also made arrangements to supply dresses for the people," he said.

Apart from Panamaram, many places within the Mananthavady block are also affected. Buses have stopped services to many places underwater, like Valliyoorkkavu and Thavinjal. As in Panamaram, people in these areas have been shifted to relief camps.

The natives are worried about being isolated as the rain continues to vent its fury. "With many roads inundated, it's impossible to travel on two-wheelers. Only cars and buses are seen moving. But it will be difficult for even buses if the rain doesn't stop. In such a scenario, the entire area will lose connectivity with other parts of the district. Already, it has become difficult for people in Valad and other areas to get to the urban areas," said Balan, a native of Koyileri. According to him, monsoon in Wayanad has not been this heavy for the past two decades.
