Don't delay compensation to monsoon victims: CM

CHIEF Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, in his review meeting, told the district collectors that the distribution of compensation to victims of monsoon calamities should not be delayed. More than 3,000 people from hundreds of families were rehabilitated to about 123 relief camps. About 450 houses got damaged in the rains and sea erosion.

Drinking water availability should be ensured at places affected by floods. Precautionary measures should be taken to prevent contagious diseases. Hospitals should be equipped to deal with any exigencies. Special attention must be given to those in the relief camps, especially if any of them suffer from diseases.

Revenue Minister E Chandrasekharan, Revenue Secretary P H Kurian, CM's private secretary M V Jayarajan, Principal Chief Secretary Nalini Netto, Principal Secretary V S Senthil and officers with the Disaster Management Wing were also present at the meeting.

In Ernakulam district alone, 12 reliief camps have been opened where 1,007 people from 284 families are staying. Geo-bags on the Chellanam coastal belt have been damaged

in Alappuzha district, five camps have been opened where people in the coastal areas suffer from sea erosion. Facilities for food distribution have been ensured. Instructions have been to issued to check heavy pumps

In Idukki, 33 families have been staying in four camps. There is no situation to open the Mullaperiyar, Idukki reservoirs, the Collector said camps are operational at Thiruvalla in Pathanamthitta. Three more camps have been opened at Mallappally. Around 198 house were partially damaged and two houses were fully destroyed. A total of 218 families are staying in 21 cmps. A loss of ₹35 lakh has been calculated

Seærosion has been reported from Koungalloor and Chavakkad in Thisur. Around 146 people have bee shifted to five relief camps.

A ttal of 32 houses were partially dataged and three fully damaged in colm. As many as 79 people are stang at two relief camps at Kolankara and Ochira.

in Flakkad, residents staying along theiver bank bore the brunt. As may as 50 are currently staying in theelief camp at Akathethara. Corpensation to farmers who suffred agri loss will soon be given
